Richard Henkes writes before his ordination to the priesthood:

I have pondered my whole life about the relationship between the ideal and reality and always sought a balance between them that I have never found. It will probably be in the future as I've already experienced:, the hardest and most dangerous hours will be those in which my expectations deceive me for the first time. I have already tried to temper my expectation of the priesthood so that - even if disappointment is present - it is far away. My strongest desire is sacrificial devotion for love. Mainly, I want to become a sacrificial priest, a cross bearer for others. I must refine this devotion in order to transcend what is earthly. [...]

It is quite strange to me lately. If I balance the work of my personal-sanctification with my apostolate, then a very certain basic mood comes about. I realize that I cannot sanctify myself (Which I've learned through experience!!). God must send His grace; I have to listen to his voice, to cooperate with his work. In God's work on others: I can do nothing. God works with his grace, I can only be a soul sacrifice for others, a cross bearer, a lightning rod of God's wrath; if I repent on behalf of other people, then the way is ready for God's grace. I used to want to do everything alone, now I see that I can do nothing; but one thing I can do is become an oblation for others. [...]
